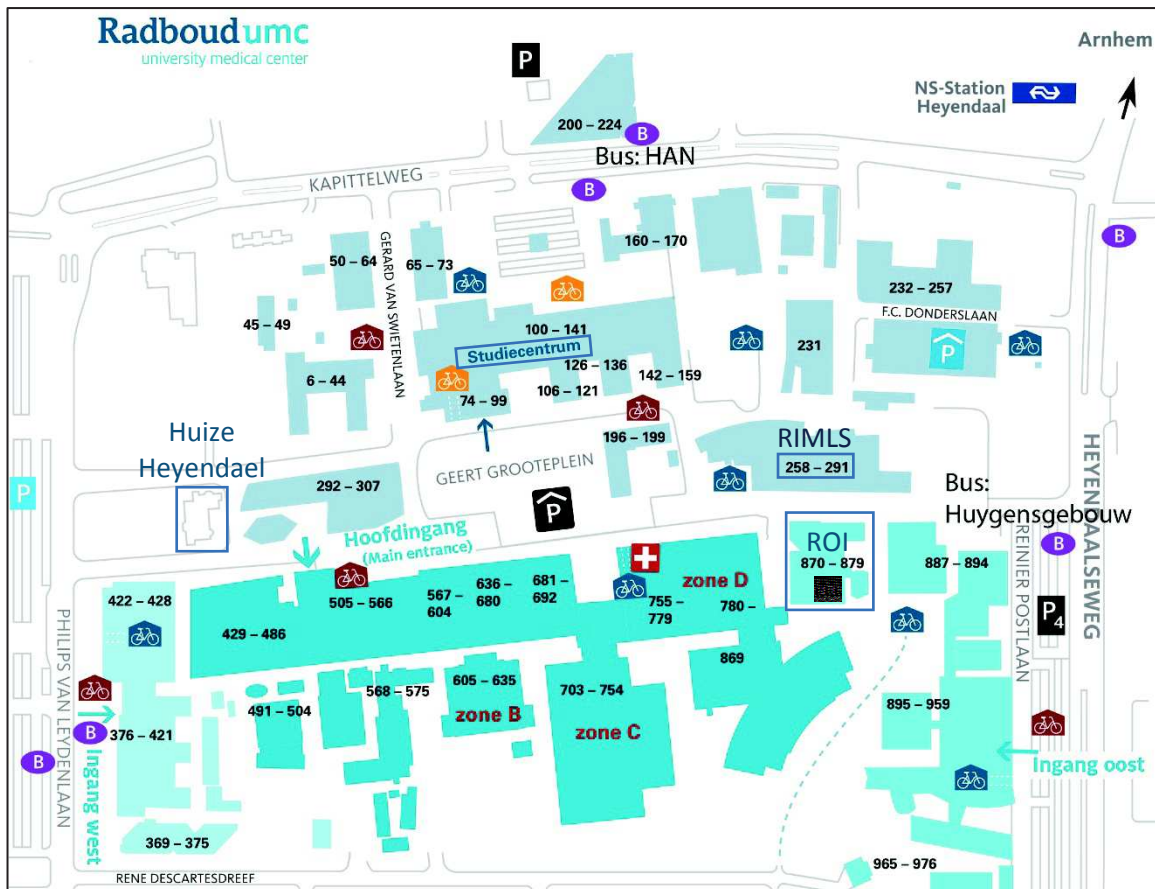
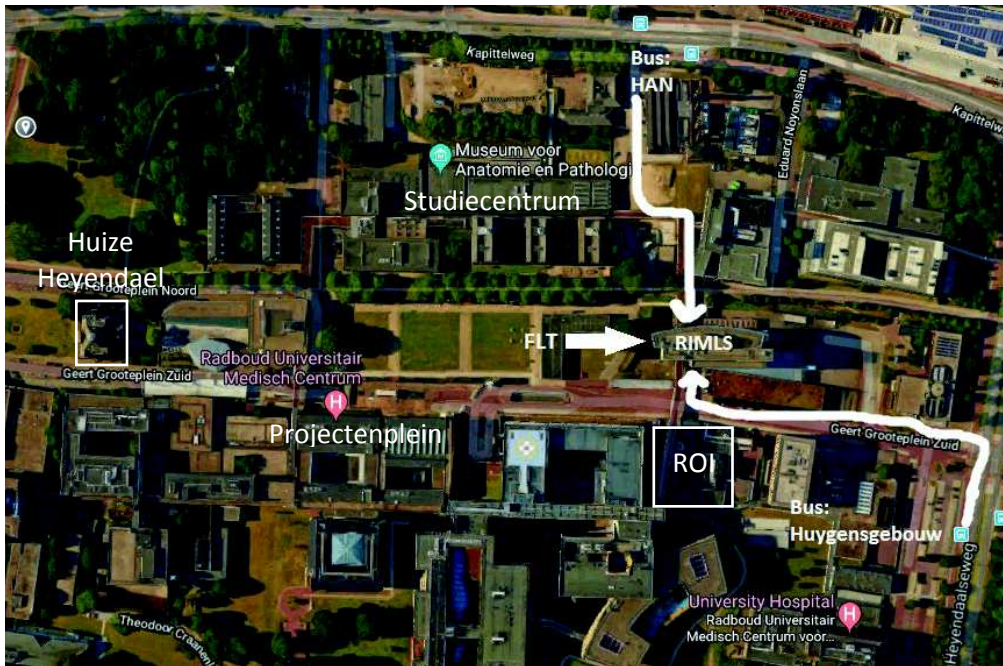
We have scheduled a PI experience exchange event in which the ESRs have the opportunity to interact with the PIs and discuss topics like how they manage their scientific career and personal life.

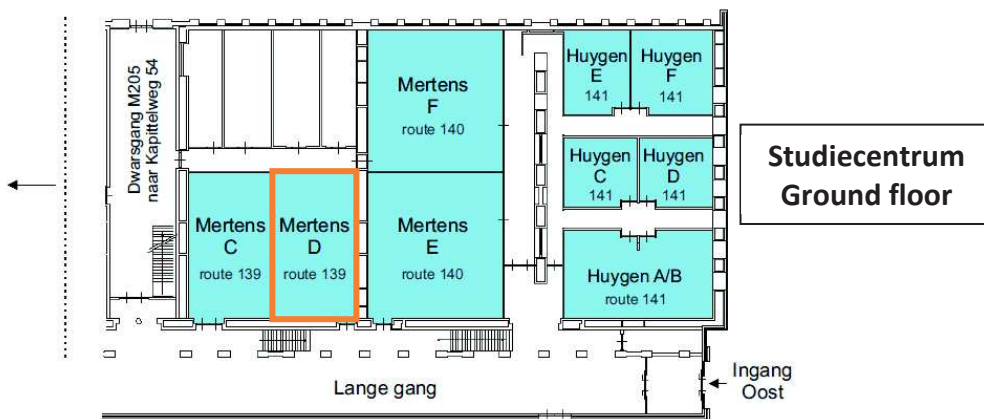
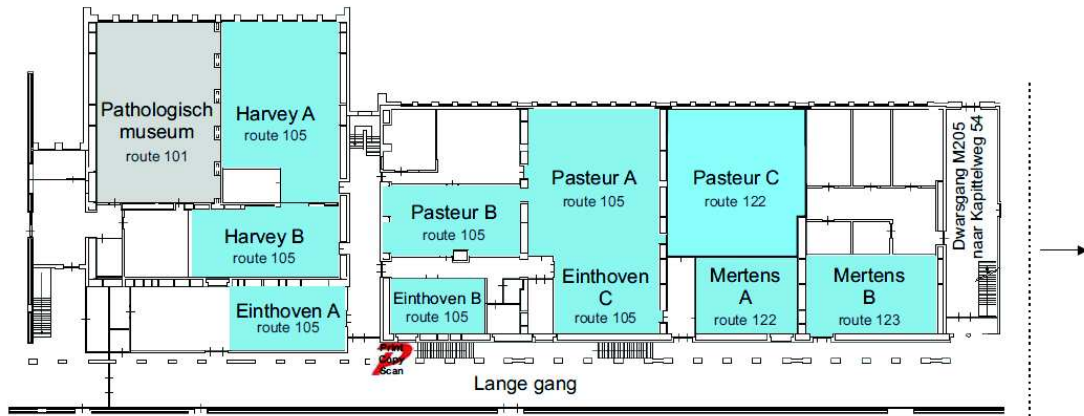
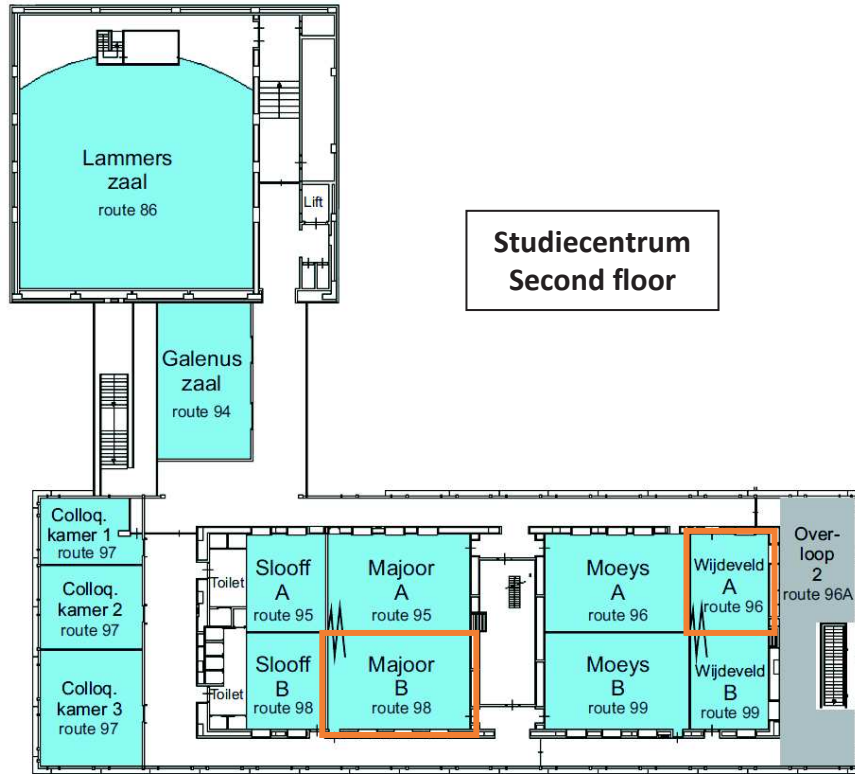

Moderation

The presentations will be moderated by another ESR (see guidelines and scheme below). The moderator will introduce the speaker and lead the discussion (please prepare at least two questions yourself).

Guidelines

The moderator makes sure that the speaker is at ease (e.g. provide water). Introduce the speaker and their work based on their abstract (see end of program book). After the presentation open the discussion and make sure questions are audible to the whole audience. Last but not least: keep track of time. Warn the speaker when they have one minute left. Also end the discussion on time when necessary.

Scientific Movie by Prof. Peter Friedl

Dr. Peter Friedl is a cell biologist and Professor with joint appointments at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center and Radboudumc, Nijmegen. He and his team are interested in the mechanisms of collective cell migration in physiological (immune defense) and pathological context (cancer invasion and metastasis). He also studies the cross-talk between cancer cell migration and its response to radiation- and chemotherapy.

Workshop 1: Science and Diversity

The optimal environment for the creative and critical processes of science, is an environment where people with different talents and different backgrounds can collaborate. Where different approaches, perspectives and inputs are valued, and individuals sense both uniqueness and belongingness at the same time. A diverse group of people also brings on challenges; it can bring on frustrations and misunderstandings and it can be time consuming to discuss different viewpoints and get to a compromise.

In the three-hour workshop, we will discuss how we can contribute to a more inclusive science by learning about:

- How exclusionary practices and processes can hinder important perspectives to be expressed and heard
- How exclusionary practices and processes are a result of implicit bias
- How to identify your own and other people's implicit bias
- How to face and react to your own implicit bias and become more inclusive in your everyday settings as a scientist.

The workshop is held by Sóley Tómasdóttir, the owner of JUST Consulting. She holds an MSc in Pedagogy with distinction from Radboud University where she studied gender and diversity within the academia. Before moving to the Netherlands, Sóley served as a city councilor in Reykjavík for 10 years with main focus on gender and human rights.

Sóley Tómasdóttir is a diversity trainer and advocate. Her expertise is based on political experience, public debates and academic knowledge. She graduated with MSc in pedagogy, gender and diversity from Radboud University where she focused on diversity and inclusion within the academic settings. Sóley is the founder of JUST Consulting, that offers advice and support to organizations on diversity management.

Workshop 2: Sell your Science

Your work is important. The results of your work therefore deserve a broad audience. But how can you reach a laymen audience? Not everyone comprehends your work. And a simple explanation very often isn't simple at all. In the workshop science communication you will learn how to write a good story about your work. We will focus on useful storytelling and presentation techniques. There is plenty of time to practice and perfect your pitch before your presentation will be challenged by a panel of critical laymen.

The workshop on science communication will be given by Marcel Wortel MSc. He is public information officer at the Radboudumc and spends his days on communicating the scientific output of the Radboudumc to a broad audience, ranging from writing press releases and articles, to cooperations with radio and television programs and citizen science projects. Marcel has over 20 years of experience in science communication, science journalism and presentation coaching.
